#### MOTION TO INTERVENE and PROTEST BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR

- The United States Department of the Interior (Department), in the exercise of its statutory responsibility on behalf of the people of the United States, moves to intervene in the abovecaptioned proceedings pursuant to 18 C.F.R. 385.214, and protests pursuant to 18 C.F.R. 385.211 the grant of application by Duke Energy Corporation. In support of this motion to intervene and protest, the Department states as follows:
- The Department has statutory responsibilities and represents public interests that are directly affected by the application to excavate sediment material from the bed of Lake Keowee in The Cliffs at Keowee Vineyards Subdivision in Pickens County, South Carolina, as set forth in the Commission's notice of August 29, 2002.
- The proposal places in jeopardy the preservation in situ of certain Cherokee village sites containing human remains, objects, and structures of great importance to Cherokee peoples and to the United States.
- The Department has broad obligations under the laws of the United States to protect Indian cultural resources that are subject to the effects of water developments permitted by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission.
- The Bureau of Indian Affairs, an agency of the Department, is the Federal agency charged with primary responsibility over matters pertaining to the administration of Indian affairs, 25 U.S.C. § 13. The Bureau also has a "unique relationship" with Indian tribes with respect tribal remains or objects. 25 U.S.C § 3010. In pursuance of that relationship the Bureau may provide technical assistance to Indian tribes concerning remains, objects, and sites with which they are culturally affiliated.
- 6. The Federal Energy Regulatory Commission has a statutory obligation under the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), 16 U.S.C. § 470 et seg. with respect to Native American districts, sites, buildings, structures and objects which are included in or eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places.

- 7. The Secretary of the Department of the Interior, is authorized by the NHPA to "use measures, including financial and technical assistance, to foster conditions under which our modern society and our prehistoric and historic resources can exist in productive harmony and fulfill the social, economic, and other requirements of present and future generations." 16 U.S.C. § 470-1(1).
- 8. For the foregoing reasons, it is submitted that: (1) the Department is authorized to participate in these proceedings; (2) the Department has interests which shall be directly affected by the outcome of these proceedings; and (3) the Department's participation is in the public interest.
