THE PROJECT RESPONDS TO DESPERATE NEED IN THE STATE OF ALASKA, CONSIDERED A HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONAL SHORTAGE AREA, WHERE AN ALASKA NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN CHILD IS 4.5 TIMES MORE LIKELY TO BE IN OUT OF HOME PLACEMENT THAN A NON-NATIVE CHILD. ANCHORAGE IS CURRENTLY HOME TO 43,020 ALASKA NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN PERSONS. DURING FY22, 194 CASES OF SUBSTANTIATED CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT CASES INVOLVED 241 ALASKA NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN CHILDREN AGES 0-5 IN ANCHORAGE. AMONG CHILDREN PLACED IN OUT OF HOME CARE THROUGH THE OCS ANCHORAGE REGIONAL OFFICE, 46 OF ALASKA NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN CHILDREN WERE IN OUT OF PREFERENCE PLACEMENTS. THE TSILQU EXPANSION GOAL IS TO INCREASE CAPACITY TO STABILIZE INDIAN FAMILIES TRIBES, PREVENT THE BREAKUP OF INDIAN FAMILIES, ENSURE THAT THE PERMANENT REMOVAL OF AN INDIAN CHILD FROM THE CUSTODY OF HIS HER INDIAN PARENT OR INDIAN CUSTODIAN IS A LAST RESORT FOR ALASKA NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN FAMILIES RESIDING IN ANCHORAGE, AK, BY CONTINUING EXPANDING ACCESS TO THE TSILQU ACES PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION CURRICULUM. THE PROPOSED PROJECT ADDRESSES THE NEEDS OF ALASKA NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN FAMILIES BY ADDRESSING GAPS IN 1) SERVICES DESIGNED TO BUILD PROTECTIVE FACTORS FOR PARENTS RECEIVING REUNIFICATION OR PRESERVATION SERVICES, 2) SERVICES THAT SUPPORT CHILD WELFARE THROUGH BY PROMOTING SECOND ORDER CHANGE, AND 3) SERVICES THAT SUPPORT TRIBAL EARLY HEAD START WORKERS, WHO ARE LIKELY TO EXPERIENCE VICARIOUS OR SECONDARY TRAUMA. (CITC) WILL PROVIDE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES AND DIRECT ASSISTANCE, AND ADVANCE COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY EFFORTS SUCH AS TRAINING AND CROSS-REFERRAL, TO ADDRESS HEIGHTENED RISK FOR SUICIDE RELATED TO IMPACTS OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC. THE POPULATION TO BE SERVED INCLUDE ALASKAN ADULTS (AGE 25 AND UP) OF ALL GENDERS AND ETHNICITIES ASSESSED AS AT RISK FOR SELF HARM OR POSSIBLE SUICIDE ATTEMPTS, PARTICULARLY THOSE WHO ARE VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. EVEN PRIOR TO THE APPEARANCE OF COVID-19, THE DEMAND FOR BEHAVIORAL SERVICES IN ALASKA FAR OUTWEIGHS PROVIDER AVAILABILITY AND THE VIRUS IS CLARIFYING AS WELL AS EXACERBATING THE ENTRENCHED DISPARITIES IN SOCIOECONOMIC, PHYSICAL, AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CONDITIONS THAT INFLUENCE EXPERIENCES OF SUICIDALITY IN ALASKA. FEW PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITIES HAVE ESCAPED THE PERSONAL IMPACT OF SELF-HARM OR SUICIDE. STATE DATA RELEASED IN 2019 TELLS US THAT ALASKA'S SUICIDE RATE HAS BEEN THE FIRST OR SECOND HIGHEST IN THE NATION SINCE 2012. IT IS THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH AMONG ALASKANS AGES 10-64 YEARS, AND THE SIXTH LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH OVERALL COMPARED WITH TENTH IN THE U.S. AS A WHOLE. IN 2017, ALASKA'S AGE-ADJUSTED SUICIDE MORTALITY RATE WAS NEARLY TWICE THE NATIONAL RATE. THE RATE AMONG AN/AI ALASKANS WAS NEARLY THREE TIMES THE NATIONAL RATE, UP 19% SINCE 2008.
